The 2010 Annual Meeting of the Canadian Anesthesiologists' Society (CAS) will be held at the Palais des Congrès in Montreal, QC.

As befits the French-speaking locale of Quebec, and in recognition of the province's historical ties with the French Society of Anesthesia and Intensive Care (SFAR), this year's conference is jointly organized by SFAR and CAS.

Events such as this year's plenary symposium offer the opportunity for delegates to collaborate and appreciate the similarities and differences between the two Anesthesia Societies and the health care systems in their respective countries.

The overall goal of the meeting is to provide a forum for attendees to acquire and exchange both knowledge and information relating to the practice of anesthesia.

Although the target audience is primarily specialist anesthesiologists, the scope and nature of the presentations and programs are suitable for family practice anesthesiologists, anesthesia residents, as well as anesthesia assistants, nurses, and allied health professionals.

Once again, the Annual Meeting Committee is bringing together a roster of outstanding leaders in anesthesiology and related fields to provide delegates with the latest thinking and the most up-to-date information. The conference will encompass the usual broad range of formats: refresher courses, symposia, workshops and case discussions.

The objective is to provide high-quality, interactive sessions that will allow registrants to gain state-of-the-art knowledge and apply that knowledge to their practice. It is hoped that the achievement of the goals and objectives of the meeting will inspire delegates to reflect on their current practice and use the knowledge gained to improve delivery of anesthesia care and anesthesia-related services as well as to expand the role of anesthesiologists in perioperative and pain management.
