This has truly been a transformative year for the Canadian Anesthesiologists' Society (CAS)—one defined by innovation, collaboration, and a deep-seated commitment to advancing excellence in anesthesia care across Canada. Our Strategic Plan has guided meaningful progress in advocacy, education, research, and public engagement to ensure CAS continues to provide leadership and support to anesthesia care providers nationwide.

Education remained a cornerstone of our work, with CAS delivering a [record-breaking number of professional development opportunities](#). New and returning initiatives, such as the CAS SAMBA Round Series, Neuroanesthesia Rounds, Pinnacle Rounds, and various accredited webinars, covered emerging trends related to patient safety and environmental sustainability. Once again, the Clinical Practice Guidelines Committee contributed expert guidance on anesthesia standards, with key updates published in the Winter 2025 issue of the *Canadian Journal of Anesthesia (CJA)*. These programs exemplify CAS' dedication to equipping anesthesiologists with the knowledge and tools to deliver safe, evidence-informed care.

Advocacy and public engagement were also central to our work in 2025. CAS contributed to national policy discussions and resources on health human resources, safe anesthesia practices, and access to essential medications—including [Canada's Critical Vulnerable Drug List](#). Our public awareness initiatives drove a wider understanding of anesthesiologists' critical role in safe perioperative care, while our sustainability-focused work highlighted innovative strategies to reduce the environmental impact of anesthesia—from energy reduction, to nitrous oxide mitigation, to industry partner collaboration.

We are particularly proud to recognize the [2025 CAS Award Winners](#), whose outstanding achievements and dedication exemplify excellence, innovation, and leadership within our specialty. From research breakthroughs to environmental sustainability solutions, these individuals demonstrated outstanding commitment to elevating anesthesia

care and Canada's wider anesthesia community. Their accomplishments inspire all of us and reflect the strength and depth of talent across our membership.

None of these accomplishments would be possible without the [extraordinary dedication of our volunteers](#)—who are essential to shaping CAS programs, guiding policy, and fostering a collaborative, engaged community. Across committees, sections, the CJA, foundations, and taskforces, our volunteer leaders contributed their time, expertise, and passion to CAS initiatives. This report underscores numerous achievements enabled through the invaluable contributions of our volunteers.

Looking ahead, we are energized by the opportunities before us in 2026. With your support, CAS will grow to become more connected, dynamic, and influential—as we advance the specialty of anesthesia and improve patient care across Canada. Advocacy and Communications Update

CAS saw momentous growth in our advocacy and communications work in 2025. We started the year with the launch of a five-year strategic plan developed with input from members, stakeholders, and staff. Half-way through, we initiated a public awareness campaign focused on the unseen work anesthesia care providers do every day. We also brought issues that matter to our members directly before governments and media and released a position statement on a vital patient safety, and quality-of-care issue. Here's a high-level look at our activities:

Strategic Plan Results: CAS is becoming a trusted information source, with advocacy discussions at the federal level now taking place. We expanded our education calendar and the CAS Research Program, and launched an open Annual Meeting call for content, new resident engagement activities, and a Membership Committee to continue driving year-over-year organizational growth. CAS also established a Governance Committee, an Anesthesia Taskforce, and new partnerships to deliver more value for our members.

Position Statement: CAS echoed the patient safety, workforce stability, and interprofessional care team effectiveness concerns with Quebec's Bill 2 expressed by our members. We respectfully [urged the Government of Quebec to re-visit the bill's framework](#) to ensure patient safety and access to care are centralized, physician autonomy and expertise are respected, and system improvements are led by transparent, collaborative processes.

Meetings with Government Leaders: CAS took part in 11 diverse and highly productive meetings with provincial and federal policy makers. Notably, we were invited to provide [expert testimony to the House of Commons Standing Committee on Health \(HESA\)](#) for the first time. CAS President Dr. Giuseppe Fuda and CAS CEO, Vanessa Foran, discussed the impact of immigration policy barriers on recruiting internationally trained healthcare professionals at this hearing.

Media Mentions: Dr. Fuda was interviewed by CTV Your Morning and outlined safe and practical solutions to Canada's anesthesiologist shortage. Over 25 articles tracked this year mentioned issues that fall under CAS' advocacy work—including national recruitment challenges, anesthesia sustainability, drug accessibility, and barriers to higher quality-of-care for patients.

Public Awareness Campaign: CAS' new "[For The Public](#)" website section—developed with our Public Affairs Committee's oversight—educates patients and their loved ones on anesthesia care providers' many roles in healthcare and the professional obstacles they face. CAS also introduced a weekly social media calendar promoting the website content.

As we reflect on the accomplishments of 2025, CAS remains devoted to advocating for the needs of anesthesiologists and advancing excellence in anesthesia care across Canada.

What's Next for 2026 - Amplifying Professional Voice

We will continue to leverage the leadership and guidance of the CAS Anesthesia Taskforce to identify evidence-informed, practical solutions to strengthen the specialty at the national level. We will continue to build strong, strategic connections with policy makers and actively look to bring our membership's voice to impactful initiatives and resources, such as Canada's Critical Vulnerable Drug List. We have also launched a revamped Advocacy section of our website and plan on expanding CAS' "For The Public" website section with a new "Meet an Anesthesiologist" interview series.

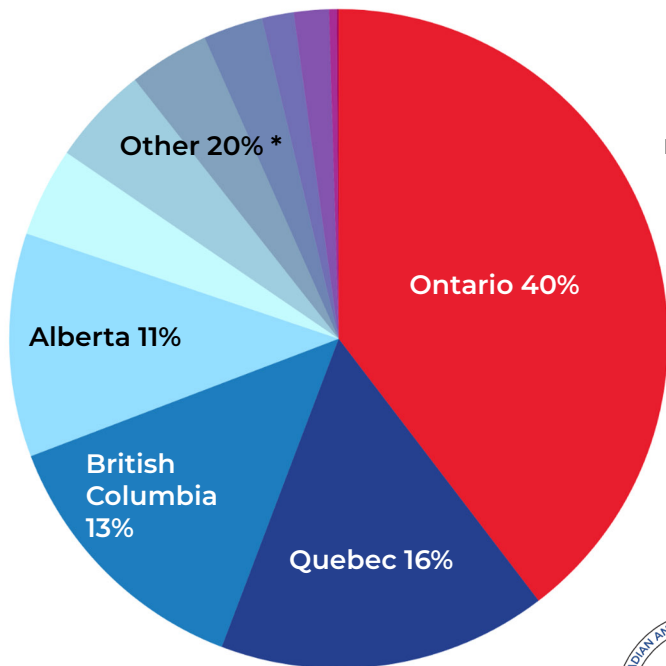

2025 Membership Demographics

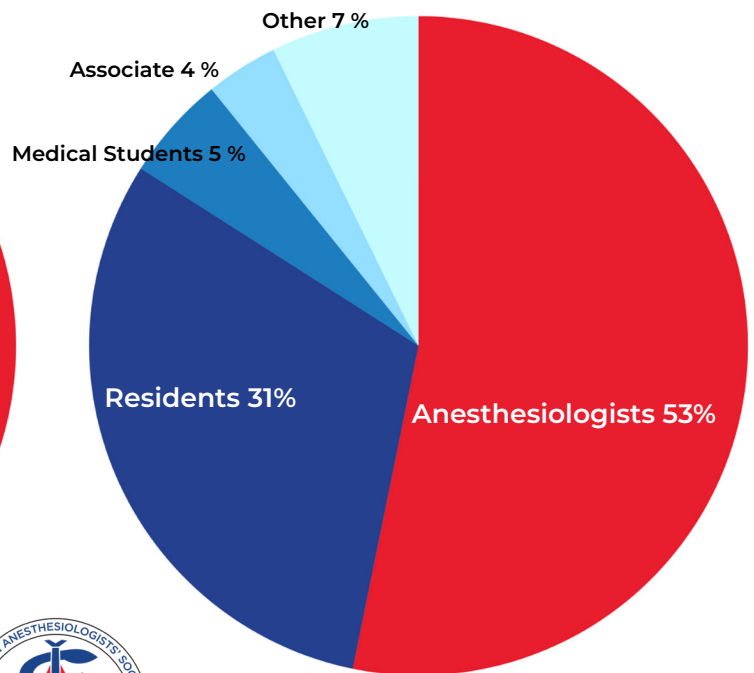
Membership by Province

Supporting Our Residents

This year marked the first full schedule of resident programming at the Annual Meeting in St. John's, Newfoundland. The brand-new "Ace It! A Prep Course for the Royal College Exam" headlined the weekend and was met with positive reception. Residents also took part in the 5th Annual Simulation Olympics—revamped into a fun escape-room-style format—as well as the annual Residents' Oral Competition a panel: "Oh The Places You'll Go: A Panel on Unique Fellowship Opportunities."

CAS continued to support the next generation of anesthesiologists in Canada by providing residents with free membership. Newly certified graduates are also offered 60%, 40%, and 20% membership discounts for their first three years of practice. 2025 saw a 30% increase in recent graduates who converted to or remained paid members compared to 2024.

Board of Directors Activities

A key priority was the launch of a comprehensive governance review, supported by the establishment of a new Governance Committee, aimed at modernizing structures, clarifying roles, and enhancing transparency across the organization. The Chair of the Board also played a central role in advancing national advocacy efforts, including engagement with federal and provincial policymakers and providing expert testimony to the House of Commons Standing Committee on Health, marking a significant milestone for the Society's influence.

In addition, the creation of the CAS Anesthesia Taskforce brought together leaders from across the specialty to address workforce challenges and identify practical, evidence-informed solutions.

CAS Events and Education

Delivering high-quality, highly relevant education is a key component of CAS' membership value proposition. To help members maintain their Royal College certification, we offer live and self-paced accredited education year-round. In 2025, CAS delivered a milestone 24 educational offerings—the most in our history—thanks to the outstanding dedication of our section and committee leaders.

The program combined hands-on workshops, plenary sessions, problem-based learning discussions, high-level symposia, competitions, and social events set against the vibrant backdrop of the East Coast.



2025 CAS Annual Meeting

Friday June 20

This year marked the first time the CAS Annual Meeting hosted a full day of Friday programming. New events included “Ace It: A Prep Course For The Royal College Exam,” which offers study strategies for exam candidates. A fresh CAS Expert Insights format provided interactive, test-enhanced learning for Section 3 CME credits. The opening session, “Balancing the Scales,” sparked a discussion on global health equity, sustainability, and ethics in anesthesiology.

Our keynote speaker was Olympic gold medalist Brad Gushue, who delivered a talk entitled: “The Roadmap to Success.” CAS Honour, Research, Best Abstracts and the Medical Student Prize was presented to their winners. The 5th Annual CAS Resident Simulation Olympics took place in a fun, new escape-room-style format, while the Richard Knill Research Oral Competition highlighted leading research from across the country. The day wrapped up with the lively CAS Soirée, which celebrated East Coast culture and Canada’s vibrant anesthesiology community.

CAS Discovery Talks and the Residents Oral Competition featured interactive presentations and cutting-edge research. Committee Highlights

Our committees, led by our extraordinary volunteer leaders, exist to educate, guide, and serve our membership. Here's a high-level look at the activities they accomplished in 2025



New Committees formed in 2025

Anesthesia Taskforce

Established to support the CAS Board of Directors, the committee will provide leadership and strategic guidance on key issues affecting the practice of anesthesiology in Canada. It will identify challenges and propose evidence-informed, practical solutions to strengthen the specialty.

Membership Committee

The committee met several times throughout the year to advance its goals of boosting member engagement and expanding the CAS membership base. The committee focused on reconnecting with lapsed members and increasing awareness of CAS' unique member value proposition through targeted outreach, tailored resources, and engaging events.

Governance Committee

The committee played a key role in assisting the Board to maintain a clear and effective governance framework. Its work was especially imperative in the first year of implementing the 2025–2030 Strategic Plan—to ensure that policies and practices supported compliance, accountability, and alignment with CAS' five-year strategic priorities.

Public Affairs Committee (PAC)

The PAC played a vital role in advocating for policies and initiatives that enhance patient safety and access to anesthesia care in Canada. The committee's work incorporated diverse geographical perspectives to develop position statements and key asks, while fostering collaborative relationships with federal, provincial, and territorial governments. The committee played a central role in launching the [For the Public section of the CAS website](#) by helping to explain the critical role of anesthesiologists and anesthesiology to the public and raising awareness of the specialty's contributions to patient care.

Research Advisory Committee (RAC)

The RAC reviewed 35 applications and awarded resident, new investigator, open, section, and subspecialty operating grants across diverse anesthesia areas—from perioperative equity and trustworthiness assessment to environmental sustainability and pediatric care. The Grant Standing Subcommittee conducted a thorough adjudication in March, and the RAC held its virtual annual meeting in May to review the process, present results, and welcome new members. These efforts reinforced CAS' commitment to advancing anesthesia research and supporting the next generation of investigators.

Committee Highlights

Annual Meeting Scientific Program Committee (AMSPC)

The AMSPC continued to lead the scientific planning for the CAS Annual Meeting by ensuring a first-rate program for attendees. For the first time, the committee introduced an open call for content, which invited all CAS members—regardless of section affiliation—to submit abstracts and proposals to the conference. The AMSPC managed the comprehensive planning and execution of the scientific program, which reinforced the Annual Meeting as a premier forum for education, innovation, and professional exchange.

Archives and Artifacts Committee (AA)

AA published four Anesthesia History Corner pieces in *Anesthesia News*—educating a wide audience on key milestones in anesthesia. It hosted the 13th Annual History Symposium at the CAS Annual Meeting. The committee moderated the World Anesthesia Day webinar in October, celebrating the evolution of anesthesia and the contributions of Canadian professionals worldwide. Archival efforts continued with the cataloguing and digitization of early equipment photographs, personal correspondence, and past presidential addresses.

Clinical Practice Guidelines Committee

The committee played a leading role in the development of the *Guidelines to the Practice of Anesthesia*, published in the Winter 2025 issue of the *CJA*. The guidelines provide key standards for anesthesia practice across Canada, with important addendums. It also delved into medication safety, ultrasound-guided central venous catheter placement, videolaryngoscopy availability, delegation of care to Anesthesia Assistants, and patient safety in non-hospital surgical and procedural settings.

Continuing Education and Professional Development (CEPD) Committee

As an accredited CPD provider of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC), CAS successfully managed its accreditation program to support a wide range of educational activities and committees.

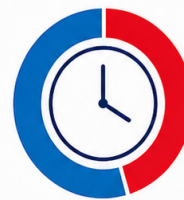

The Ambulatory Section continues to champion innovation in perioperative, ambulatory, and airway anesthesia. In 2025, the section hosted the [CAS SAMBA Ambulatory Anesthesia Round Series](#), a collaborative initiative with the [Society for Ambulatory Anesthesia \(SAMBA\)](#). Four rounds held throughout the year attracted strong attendance and led to engaging discussions among Canadian anesthesiologists. Building on this success, the series returns in 2026 and continues to provide valuable insights and learning opportunities for the community.

Critical Care Section

The Critical Care Section focused on strengthening engagement and clarifying its national priorities through a comprehensive member survey that examined practice patterns, academic involvement, and workforce challenges. Results highlighted that most members practice in hybrid anesthesia-ICU roles with significant teaching and quality improvement engagement, while identifying key pressures, including balancing OR and ICU responsibilities, limited protected academic time, and burnout concerns. Survey findings directly informed section programming, including a well-attended Critical Care session at the CAS Annual Meeting that addressed psychological safety, team culture, and crisis leadership.

Cardiovascular and Thoracic (CVT) Section

The CVT Section delivered a dynamic and educationally rich year highlighted by a strong program at the CAS Annual Meeting in St. John's—which featured high-impact sessions such as Echo Jeopardy, POCUS in the OR, and the Earl Wynands Lecture. The section strengthened national and international collaborations with the [European Association of Cardiothoracic Anaesthesiology and Intensive Care \(EACTAIC\)](#), the [International Academy of Cardiac Anaesthesiologists \(IACA\)](#), and the [Canadian Society of Cardiac Surgeons](#). It also advanced discussions to establish an annual Earl Wynands Research Grant supported by CARF matching funds.

Environmental Sustainability Section

The Environmental Sustainability Section's primary activity was hosting the CAS Earth Day Webinar: "Our Power, Our Planet" on April 22. This event brought experts together to raise awareness about the impact of climate change on healthcare and equip anesthesiologists with practical strategies to reduce carbon emissions and overall environmental impact in clinical practice. The webinar covered CAS' [sustainability position](#), climate change trends in 2025, nitrous oxide impacts and mitigation, energy reduction in the OR, and strategies to implement industry partnerships that combine advocacy with practical approaches to greener anesthetic care.

Neuroanesthesia Section

The Neuroanesthesia Section continued to promote education, programming, and advocacy related to neurological anesthesia—including the anesthetic management of patients with diseases of the central nervous system affecting the brain and spine. In 2025, the section expanded its educational offerings with two dedicated neuroanesthesia rounds—one providing updates on the latest advances in neuroanesthesia and a second that focused on total intravenous anesthesia and target-controlled infusion (TIVA–TCI).

Obstetric Section

The section delivered a robust academic and educational program, highlighted by a \$20,000 section research grant. At the CAS Annual Meeting, the section hosted a comprehensive slate of lectures, PBLDs, and expert panels that addressed high-stakes obstetric emergencies, complications, dexmedetomidine use, breastfeeding considerations, and neuro-obstetric clinical challenges (in collaboration with the Neuroanesthesia Section). The section also advanced continuing professional development through the publication of a CPD module on post-dural puncture headache in the *CJA*, as well as a webinar on the topic.

Regional and Acute Pain Section

The Regional Anesthesia and Acute Pain Section advanced high-impact educational and collaborative initiatives nationally and internationally. In partnership with the [American Society of Regional Anesthesia and Pain Medicine](#), members published work on remotely teaching the use of ultrasound-guided regional anesthesia in under-resourced countries—which underscored Canada's contribution to global equity in care. The section also collaborated with the [European Society of Regional Anaesthesia and Pain Therapy](#) and CAS to participate in the 2nd World Day of Regional Anesthesia and Pain Medicine—themed “Joining Hands for a Pain Free Future Worldwide”—to showcase Canadian expertise on the international stage. At the CAS Annual Meeting, the section delivered well-attended panels, debates, and hands-on workshops, and presented its Best Abstract and Research Grant awards in collaboration with [CARF](#).

We have published the *Canadian Journal of Anesthesia* since 1954. Monthly issues include Reports of Original Investigation (clinical and laboratory research articles), Systematic Reviews, Narrative Reviews, accredited CPD modules, invited Editorials, Reflections, Case Reports/Case Series, Letters to the Editor, and Special Articles. The CJA proudly publishes the annually revised [CAS Guidelines to the Practice of Anesthesia](#). Led by Editor-in-Chief Dr. Stephan Schwarz, the editorial team includes 22 Editorial Board members (50% of whom are women) and 12 editors.

2025 again was a very active year, with one of the highlights being the publication of three new accredited CPD Modules under the leadership of the CJA's CPD Editor, Dr. Kathryn Sparrow. On the [CJA's website](#), we now feature six permanent Topical Collections, with the latest addition in 2025 reflecting a new feature that we soft launched in July, called “Editor's Choice.” This designation highlights one to two hand-selected articles per month that are deemed to be particularly noteworthy. This new online Topical Collections can be found along with the five others on the CJA homepage under “[Articles](#)”

The year featured notable national international activity and representation of the CJA, which included participation of Dr. Schwarz in the inaugural Fostering Accountability for the Integrity of Research Studies (FAIRS) meeting at Oxford University, as well as the International Anesthesiology Journal Editors' meeting at the Euroanaesthesia congress. Dr. Schwarz also followed invitations to give Journal-related lectures at McGill University and the [World Airway Management Meeting](#) in Florence/Italy. A final highlight of 2025 was the awarding of two editors with a Springer Nature Editor of Distinction Award—Associate Editor Dr. Gianni Lorello and Dr. Schwarz—in recognition of “meticulous assessment of submissions and rigorous management of the peer review process, safeguarding the scientific accuracy of the published record.”

The [Canadian Anesthesia Research Foundation \(CARF\)](#) was founded in 1979 to administer funds and provide support to Canadian researchers in anesthesia who are CAS members. These funds are essential to ensuring the stability of anesthesia research in Canada.

In 2025, CARF introduced new research awards to recognize and stimulate high-impact inquiry. The BCAS Pieter Swart Perioperative Research Award supports perioperative care advancements and the Patient Blood Management Award, supported by Octapharma Canada Inc., underscores the essential role of anesthesiologists in blood management practices. A new Environmental Sustainability Research Award was launched to drive innovation in sustainable anesthesia practices, with at least \$20,000 allocated annually to support research that directly reduces environmental impact while maintaining patient safety and clinical excellence.

Throughout the year, CARF strengthened collaboration with CAS sections and other stakeholders to broaden the reach and relevance of its funding programs. CARF also welcomed key leadership additions to its board, including Dr. Summer Syed, whose research expertise will elevate strategic research priorities, and Brian McWilliams from GE Healthcare, who will help facilitate industry collaboration opportunities.

Donor recognition featured in quarterly issues of [Anesthesia News](#) highlighted community generosity and reinforced the foundation's mission of enabling meaningful investments in research excellence. The successful joint CARF and CASIEF fundraiser at the CAS Annual Meeting also cultivated broader philanthropic support for CARF initiatives.

The [Canadian Anesthesiologists' Society International Education Foundation \(CASIEF\)](#) was created in 1996 with a mission to support partners in low and middle-income countries in expanding their anesthesiology workforce and improve patient care. In 2025, CASIEF continued to make transformative contributions toward global anesthesia education and capacity building in low- and middle-income countries. CASIEF's educational partnerships in countries including Rwanda, Ethiopia, Guyana, and Burkina Faso remained central to its 2025 accomplishments. Canadian volunteers contributed to teaching missions, simulation training, and faculty development, enhancing local anesthesiology training programs, and expanding clinical capabilities in partner settings.

Throughout the year, CASIEF expanded its fundraising and community engagement efforts. Important initiatives included the CASIEF – Lifebox Resident Challenge, which focused on raising funds to distribute capnographs and other safety equipment critical to safe anesthesia care in resource-limited settings. CASIEF drove campaign awareness and participation among residents across Canada to build a national pipeline of global health advocates.

CASIEF's visibility and influence were elevated through a dedicated symposium that addressed physician well-being and global health themes at the CAS Annual Meeting. The joint CASIEF and CARF Annual Meeting fundraiser supported both global education and research initiatives—reflecting a unified philanthropic culture within the CAS community. This year, Dr. Teresa Skelton assumed the role of CASIEF Chair, bringing renewed focus and leadership strength to the foundation's global education portfolio. Donor recognition was also featured prominently in quarterly communications to spotlight the donor generosity that enables CASIEF's sustained impact of making a meaningful difference in global education and patient care outcomes.

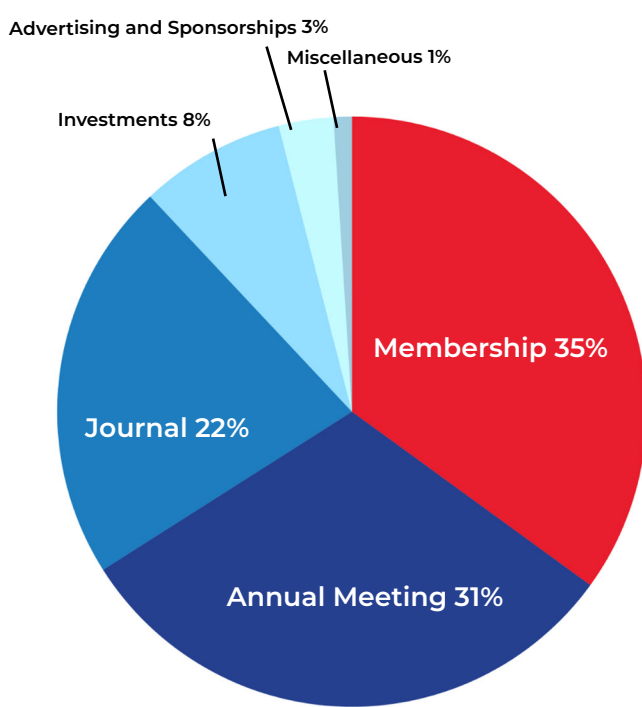


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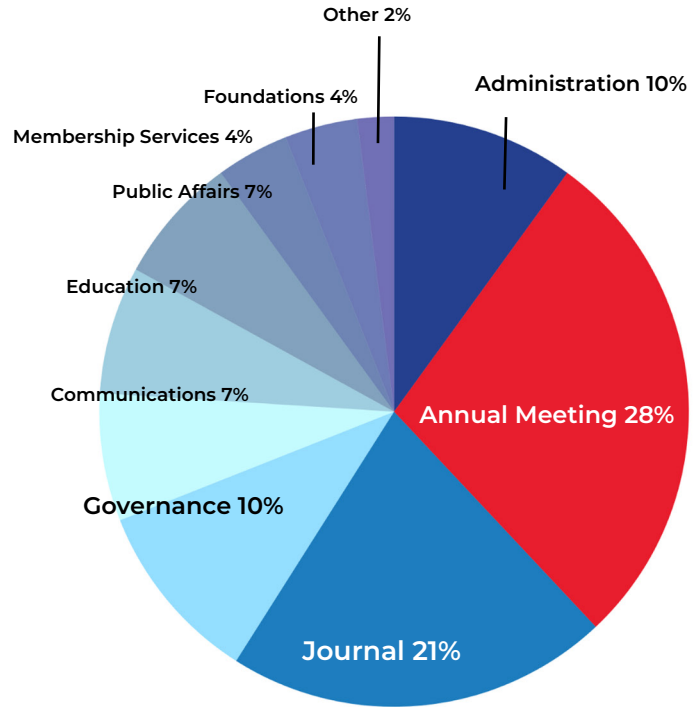

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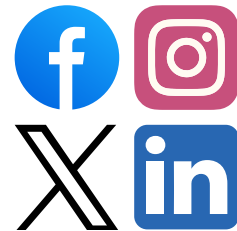


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
